- Accelerated Program Finish your program in 25 weeks.
- Columbia's Education Assistant Certificate Program is licensed by the Private Vocational Training Branch of the Alberta Government.
- A solid foundation of theory and practice that will prepare you to work in a school or other educational setting.
- Practical strategies to support cognitive, behavioural, and social learning of students from kindergarten to adult learners.
- A special focus on inclusive educational practices for students with special needs.
- Complete 150 hours of real world experience through a practicum placement and 12 hours of in-class practicum workshops. Additional 8 hours of Non-Violent Crisis Intervention training.

What do Education Assistants Do?

- Work under the supervision of one or several teachers
- Assist students who have special needs (ie. Physical, Learning Disabilities)
- Work with individual students or groups of students both in the classroom and other settings.
- Implement lesson and behavioural plans for students as directed by the teacher.
- Motivate and encourage students to participate in learning activities.

- · Observe and report student behaviour and progress
- Prepare learning materials and use assistive technology to support student learning

Program Entry Requirements

Standard Admission

- · Alberta high school diploma, verified by transcript, or non-Alberta equivalent, and
- English 30-1 with a final mark of 60% English 30-2 with a final mark of 70%, or equivalent

Mature Students

Students who do not meet the academic requirements listed above can apply through academic assessment. Academic assessment students must meet the following:

- 19 years of age or older
- Out of high school for 1 year
- Successfully meet the entry levels on Columbia College's Accuplacer assessment test or equivalent

Additional Requirements

- · Attend Columbia College's Program Orientation and tuition-free online College Skills for Success course before the start of your program.
- · Admissions interview(s) to determine suitability for the profession and opportunity for success in the program.
- Evidence of the application for a Police Information Check, Vulnerable Sector Search and Child Intervention Check must be submitted prior to the start of the program.
- Standard First Aid and CPR Training Level C (prior to starting practicum by the end of the first semester).
