License Requirements

After successfully passing the provincial exam and receiving your certificate, you must apply for your licensing at an approved Registry Office or the Solicitor General's Office. To be eligible for licensing, you must meet the following criteria:

1. Be at least 18 years old at the time of registration.
2. Fluent in English (CLB score of 5 or higher).
3. Submit a current Police Information Check, including a Vulnerable Sector Search, with no serious convictions. Include a signed passport-sized photo provided by the police.
4. Pass the Alberta Investigator Training Exam with a minimum score of 80%.
5. Be eligible to work in Canada as a Canadian citizen, Landed Immigrant, Permanent Resident, or hold a valid Work Visa.
