## **Program Entry Requirements**

For entry into the Practical Nursing Professional Program, students can qualify through **Standard** or **Mature** Admission:

#### Standard Admission

Prospective students who are **18 years of age and under** can apply through Standard Admission, meeting the following criteria:

- Alberta high school diploma, verified by transcript, or non-Alberta equivalent, and:
- English 30-1 with minimum final mark of 60% or 70% in English 30-2 **or** equivalent
- Credit in Math 20-1 or 60% in Math 20-2 or equivalent
- Biology 30 with minimum final mark of 60% or equivalent

#### **Mature Student Admission**

Prospective students who are **19 years of age or older** can apply through Mature Admission, meeting the following criteria:

- Have been out of high school for 1 year
- Have met academic English, Math, and Biology requirements or successfully meet entry levels on the ACCUPLACER Assessment or equivalent

#### **Additional Requirements**

- Attend Columbia College's Orientation prior to starting
- Admissions interview(s) to determine suitability for the profession and success in the program
- Columbia's Math 99 Assessment (note: all applicants must take the MATH 99 Assessment, even those who submit transcripts)

### Clinical Placement Requirements

- Up-to-date immunization record
- Police Information Check with Vulnerable Sector Search
- Heart and Stroke BLS
- N95 Mask Fit Testing
